Mayors Update

Over the past month I've had the pleasure of representing Northallerton at a number of community events and meetings. I recently joined

partners from North Yorkshire Council, the BID and the Tourist Information Centre at a Town Team meeting, where we reviewed ongoing work to support and promote the town. I've also taken on a new voluntary role as a Town Ambassador with Hambleton Community Action, welcoming several coach groups visiting Northallerton.

I was delighted to help start the annual pancake races on the Applegarth and later speak on York Radio about the importance of preserving this well-loved green space. Town councillors have also been closely involved in North Yorkshire Council's workshops on the emerging Town Investment Plan, which will help shape future priorities for Northallerton.

This month I attended a prostate health event run by the Thirsk & Northallerton Lions, who successfully encouraged almost 100 men to take part in PSA testing. Finally, I met with the Mayor of Richmond and the team behind Richmond's Town of Culture 2028 bid, which Northallerton Town Council has formally supported and which has been warmly welcomed locally.
